School Report Aoife Cahill	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We gained 10 new students in January and are at a total of 160 students • <i>New kindergarten programming for 2018/2019</i> - we will be offering a Pre-Kindergarten program and a Kindergarten Plus program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Pre-Kindergarten Program</i> – The preschool that is run by Lisa Baker will join St. Luke. For the past 6 years the preschool has operated out of St. Luke as its own entity. Lisa will become an EA in the program and a teacher will be hired. The program will be offered in the same space and Lisa will still run her before and after school care. The pre-kindergarten program and regular kindergarten will run Tuesdays, Thursdays, and 10 Fridays • <i>Kindergarten Plus</i> – will be offered to students that are 4 and 5 years old and will be offered on opposite days as the regular kindergarten program • Grade 5/6 Basketball has began and is coached by Miss Cormier • <i>Mindful Movements</i> - Britney Stahl, a St. Luke parent, who brought Mindful Movements to our students would like to offer a 6 week program for families. Classes will be after school on Mondays starting at the end of February. Information will be the weekly memo • Thank you to Brian Watmough for staining the wood in the hallway • Grade 8 students moving on to ABJ will have a transition day on Monday February 26, 2018 • <i>Skiing</i> – as a staff we talked about going skiing as a school to Rabbit Hill. Lift

	<p>ticket, equipment rental, and lessons will be around \$40-45 per student. Busing is extra. Parent Council has budgeted to support a physical activity for students. We would be looking at going in early March.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Milk program</i> – changes are going well. With pre-ordering of milk we are able to accurately order only the milk we need which has helped reduce waste • Report cards will be available online January 30. PD day January 31 • <i>Adoration</i> – will be on February 5 and 6. We'll have a mass on February 5 @ 8:30 a.m. The host will be blessed at the mass and placed in a monstrance, the monstrance will then be placed in our chapel and students will pray with the blessed sacrament present • <i>Chromebook</i> - leasing will end in June of this year. Chromebooks will not be available for leasing for the 2018/2019 school year • <i>First Communion</i> – at OLPH will be grouped by schools, St. Luke students will celebrate their First Communion on Sunday May 6, 2018 @ 8:30 a.m. • We will have a Strawberry Tea on May 17, 2018 from 2-3 p.m. All families are welcome and there will be a special celebration honoring all our volunteers. This will be a chance to get together and visit as a school community • Thank you for the donations that we received for the baskets that were auctioned off at Christmas in the Country. Money raised from the basket auction supported Valeda House. I would like to ask if Parent Council would be interested in organizing a social justice project • Indigo Fundraiser – details are still being worked out, event will possibly be on May 5, 2018
