School Report Aoife Cahill	<ul> <li>Three Way Conferences – Will be held on Wednesday March 20. Booking will open this Friday.</li> <li>School Sign – Three mock-ups of our school sign have been created and will be on display during three way conferences. Parents will be able to vote on their favorite one. Staff and students will vote as well. Once the design is chosen a sub committee will be formed and they will decide if any tweaks need to be made to the design. The sign will be visible to traffic east and westbound along highway 14. There will be an area on the sign where school events like the open house and plant sale can be advertised.</li> <li>Face 2 Face Ministries – Student's enjoyed the liveliness that Face 2 Face Ministries brought to our school last Monday March 4. EICS covered the cost of this year's school retreat. (Colette Lastiwka) If the school plans to book again next year a decision will be made at the budget meeting in October if school council will offer their financial support.</li> <li>Rooney &amp; Punyi – (Melissa Damur) We are looking at the possibility of bringing Rooney &amp; Punyi to the school September 9-20, 2019. Rooney &amp; Punyi are a local husband and wife duo that offer an artist in residency program (http://www.interviewhistory.ca/). They will come to the school and work with all students in grades pre K-8 for 56 sessions over a two week period. At the end the of sessions a school wide production will be put on. The total cost is \$9600 we can apply for a grant from the AFA (Alberta Foundation for the Arts) that will cover half the cost. Jiscussion – different options for supporting this were discussed including parent council funding the full amount of \$4800, or parent council funds some of the money and the rest will be added to student's field trip fees at \$32 per student. Other things discussed was the time of the year that they would be booked there were concerns over it being a lot for students and teachers just beginning a new school year. The second part of the census will be done on Saturday March 30. • <i>Accountability Pillar Survey Results</i> – We have a binder compiled of results from the accountability pillar surveys. A spread sheet shows the areas that we improved on, stayed the same, or decreased in. The results were shared with the staff and they were asked to answer three questions about what stands out, what are the successes, and what is an area they have further questions about. We'll meet as a committee on Monday April 8 and decide what our focus (assurance plan) will be for next year. Parents are welcome to join this committee. Themes we noticed from parent surveys were communication and diverse programming (option classes). Themes from student survey results showed strengths for physical education, snacks from our nutritional program, and RPG (role playing games) run by Mr. Driedger, the junior high students also enjoy being included in school wide activities. Areas of concern from staff surveys were workload and cleanliness. We will work on how to maintain the areas of strength and how to we can improve the areas
of concern. The results will be in the staff room and are available for anyone to review.
