- No Stone Left Alone our school traveled to the South Cooking Lake Cemetery to lay poppies at all the gravestones of Canadian Military. Insurance – Erin Crawley

• Some parents are feeling that the Smore is getting bogged down with too much stuff. We thought we could suggest a streamline of some sort. We did see the changed format this past week and it looks much better. The new table of contents only shows up when looking at the memo on a desktop.

Parent Feedback on School Supplies – Shelby Mistecki

 Some parents have expressed frustration/concern on this topic. The ask at the start of the school year is that everything is to be labelled. This year, some classes combined all supplies, making all the labelling we do unnecessary. If everything just goes in one bin, do parents get unused supplies back? How does that get kept track? Not all parents can subsidize school supplies for other students. It would be great to get better communication on this at the beginning of the school year.

Alberta School Council Engagement Grant – Erin Crawley

• We have had this grant (\$500) for two years and have not used it. We didn't end up using Cobblestone Collective last year as our timing was too late (Google Education). We will see if we can get something going for January/February.
